- · Exhibitors may enter no more than three items in each class
- Entries are accepted on the day but if possible please submit your entry form by the Thursday before the show
- · Exhibits must be staged between 9am and 11am
- Entry charge 50p for all classes except those limited to child entrants
- · All children's entries must have the age of the entrant clearly marked on the exhibit
- Prize money: 1st -£2.50, 2nd -£2, 3rd -£1.50
- Cups and shields will be presented from 4pm
- · All cups and shields to be held for one year
- No exhibits should be removed before 4.30pm
- Children's classes will be judged in age bands: Under 5 years, 5—8 years and 9—11 years.
- The Committee accepts no liability for loss or damage to exhibits

#### RECIPE - Snickerdoodle Crazy Cake

#### Filling ingredients

 $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups all-purpose flour

1 cup light brown sugar

2 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp cream of tartar

1/2 tsp salt

5 tbsp vegetable oil

1 tsp vanilla essence

1 tsp apple cider vinegar

1 cup water

#### Method

- Preheat oven to 180°C.
- Grease the interior of an 8 inch  $\times$  8 inch baking pan. Then line it with a large sheet of parchment paper. The parchment paper should be large enough to line the bottom and the sides.
- Whisk together flour, sugar, cinnamon, baking soda, cream of tartar and salt.
- Add vanilla, vinegar, oil and water. Whisk everything until batter becomes smooth and evenly combined.
- Pour the batter into your prepared baking tin. Place cake into oven and bake for 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean and the top of the cake should bounce back when you apply light pressure.
- While cake is cooking, making the topping. Add cinnamon and sugar to a small bowl and whisk to evenly combine.
- When cake is done, sprinkle cinnamon sugar evenly over the surface of the cake while the cake is still warm.

Topping

1/2 tbsp granulated sugar

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon


